Be a caremongerer

At the start of the coronavirus pandemic, a mutual-aid movement dubbed as "caremongering" quickly spread throughout Canada. Within 72 hours, 35 Facebook groups were launched so people could request and offer assistance.

This altruistic effort is essentially the opposite of fearmongering. "We wanted to switch that around and get people to connect on a positive level," says Mita Hans, who helped set up the first group. The movement, she adds, "spread the opposite of panic in people, brought out community and camaraderie, and allowed us to tackle the needs of those who are at-risk all the time — now more than ever."

One disabled man in Halifax who received aid through a caremongering group said it felt "like a hug." That's intentional, says participant Valentina Harper. "I think it is really showing people there is still hope for humanity." When the pandemic is history, may we all continue to be caremongerers in our communities.

We carry worries even to worship. But our Good Shepherd says, "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32, ESV).




